


A Closer Look at the 2010 Baltimore Citizen Survey Results Vol.1 Issue 9

The 2010 Baltimore Citizen Survey asked 1,800 respondents a series of questions to measure their satisfaction with the services offered by the City of Baltimore and the quality of life in the City. This report focuses on individuals **who live in the Northern District**.



The Northern Planning District differs from the population of Baltimore as a whole in terms of the proportion of homeowners, highly educated and high income individuals, and individuals over the age of 65.


These residents are also more likely to have college and graduate educations, possibly leading to the higher proportion of incomes over \$75,000 and the higher proportion of homeowners.



Northern District

The Northern Planning District encompasses the corridors up Greenmount Avenue, North Charles Street, and Falls Road. Druid Hill Park is in the districts southwest corner, while the southeast corner is made up of the Barclay and Better Waverly neighborhoods and Charles Village.

The district contains the Johns Hopkins University Homewood Campus between



Hampden and Charles Village. The District also contains Roland Park and North Roland Park, a possible reason for the larger proportion of higher incomes.


Findings

Of the respondents in the Northern District, 32% said that they visited a City-run library at least monthly, while only 27% of the population as a whole visited a library as often.

Northern District residents were also more likely to make contact with a City employee, with 58% of respondents having some contact in the prior year. Only 52% of the population as a whole had a similar contact rate.

In addition, 72% of respondents said that they felt safe at night in their neighborhoods. This is significantly higher than many of the other planning districts.

Northern District Responses
